1. Mathematics 249 – Introductory Calculus

2. **Prerequisites:** A grade of 70 per cent or higher in Pure Mathematics 30. 3. **Grading:** The University policy on grading and related matters is described in sections F.1 and F.2 of the online University Calendar. In determining the overall grade in the course, the following weights will be used:

<i>Final Exam</i>		50 % (To be scheduled by the Registrar)

The various components above will be assigned a percentage score and will be combined with the indicated weights to produce an overall percentage in the course. The conversion table between course percentage and letter grade will be provided at least one week before the withdrawal deadline.

A passing grade in the Final Examination is essential for an overall grade of C- or better.

Calculus Connections is a companion course to this one offered by Y. Elsabrouty. There are no prerequisites and there is no cost to the student.
